

Bill asked if she would be willing to share her testimonial with others and would she like to help with the renewal of the Columbus area. She responded with a firm "Yes!" Because she had been so blessed in her marriage by dialoging, knowing and loving her husband so deeply, she is willing to reach out and pass on the blessings to others.

To us, this is a true meaning of Thanksgiving and Christmas. We wish for each of you a deeper awareness and appreciation than ever before of God's blessings in your lives and the peace of God that cannot be comprehended in human terms.

Saturday morning started with a Matins service led by our Reunion musicians, some "Hug Therapy" and Prayer Circles. Our guest speakers were David and Teresa Ferguson of Intimate Life Ministries in Austin, Texas. We were blessed with their honesty and humor. We laughed and also were awed by the way they revealed from scriptures "What God wants from our marriage." Some insightful concepts were:

- God is always looking for a channel to be present to us. Marriage can be that channel. God's presence was made known in the Pillar of Fire, leading the Israelites out of Egypt; the burning bush; the human— Je
 - sus the Christ. God wants to be known and present on earth through our loving hearts and the loving ways we treat each other.



- Christ will come along side us and teach us how to love our spouse! They used the illustration of an oxen yoke. It has two spaces, in which the farmer puts a trained ox with an untrained one so the inexperienced one will learn from the other. (Matt. 11:29) Jesus wants to be yoked with us in order to teach us how to love our spouse!
- God will reveal to us our spouses unique needs so we can minister to them.
- How do we minister to each other's needs? The first thing Jesus did was to weep with those who were hurting and then took care of their needs. (John 11:35—the story of Lazarus.)
- There are needs behind our feelings. Marriage is a matter of the heart, emotions and feelings. Our marriage is alive and needs to be nurtured or it will become dead and filled with "doing things."
- Do we want to react to anger with anger—or minister to the hurt in our spouse.

 Matthew 25:40 says, "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." How we treat our spouse is how we are treating Jesus.

After each presentation, we were adjourned so we could write and share our feelings.

The only thing left to do on Saturday night was to party! We ate Pacific Northwest salmon and beef tenderloin and danced the night away. Ron and Pat Olson were our dinner hosts. There was a fairly equally divided group of people from each decade of the 70's, 80's and 90's. The smallest contingent was from the new decade of the 2000's--but they were the best dancers!

Sunday was our time to "Embrace Our Future, Where Dreams Have No Boundaries." Our leadership couples—Dan and Judy Teuscher of ILME, Jim and Anita Tollefson and Ted and Marty Hartman of NAR and Kari and Anna Alander of EUR (all the way from Finland!) spoke of the future vision of International Lutheran Marriage Encounter; how we will keep the vision alive. 
