REFLECTIONS ON THE NAR BOARD MEETING

Some thoughts of one ILME family member couple from Sweden visiting a NAR Board Meeting for the first time.

"It was a wonderful meeting!"
We sometimes express ourselves
like that when we have been to a
service filled with love and the
spirit of God.

The NAR Board Meeting in Ontario, California, February 4-6 was a wonderful meeting. From the very beginning we had the feeling that we were a part of the family, not just someone coming from outside to observe. Some of the members of the board we knew from before but that didn't make any difference. It was the wonderful warmth between the couples that really made us happy.

We were touched by the open sharing at the very beginning of the meeting. The question that was passed around was, "What do you want to be prayed for during the meeting?" That question says more about our hearts than when we usually share: what do you feel just now? And in addition to that, every couple got a special, but unknown, prayer couple for the time of the meeting. The identity of that prayer couple was revealed as the last item of the agenda.

We got an excellent teaching of what it means to make a decision through consensus. And that was put into practice in the way the board solved a difficult issue about the use of communion at weekends.

Everyone was able to express their opinion and was listened to. There was enough time – no hurry.

And at the end of the discussion, every district gave their decision. By then, the atmosphere was almost holy. No one wanted to hurt anyone. There was so much love in the talks and when at last consensus seemed close, someone suggested, "Let us pray". We all raised, prayed and sung "Praise God from whom all blessings flow" standing in a big circle holding hands. Afterwards someone said something that brought us to tears: "I feel joy but there is pain in my heart". That is the way a good family acts. Jesus' words were close: "As I have loved you..."

We would like to say a few words about what is called "The Charter".

That document was presented at the meeting. The Charter to be is there to promote the ME work in a world wide context. It's necessary, even in a family, to have rules for how to cooperate together. The existing rules, the Bylaws, has up to now been the guidelines for this. But they are very detailed and not quite applicable in all parts of our

international family. Therefore it would perhaps be better to create a framework, a foundation or an agreement, that describes the basics for the ME-family. This Charter shall be applicable everywhere in the Lutheran world. Every region is then supposed to write their own bylaws saying how to operate the things according to regulations, needs and demands in our different ME-countries. The Charter is describing the principals and promoting the family feeling. In what ways this is implemented can differ a bit from country to country.

The Charter is now to be handed over to the Regions for discussions and reactions.

We would like to express our thanks to the NAR Exec's, the Teuschers and the Bushes!

New Beginnings For LME In Alaska

The story we are about to share with you is not a fairy tale or a great novel. It will not be on the nation's best seller list, nor will it receive prestigious awards or achieve great fame. It is, on the other hand, a story worth telling. A story to inspire, lift spirits and motivate. It is a slice of human drama with all the elements found in a best seller or a beloved novel. It is a story of faith, struggle, determination, perseverance and success. It is also a story that reveals once again how God uses his people to accomplish his purposes and his work.

Let start at the beginning in Alaska, way back in the 80s. The Alaska Marriage Encounter Community had achieved the ultimate. All board positions filled on a regular basis, full weekends being held almost every month, a large team of presenters, and a thriving and extremely active community. If that wasn't enough, the Alaska LME community was also involved on a national scale including representation in national meetings and hosting one of the LME Family Reunions. It was likely as strong as any community in LME at that time.

Alas, like most things in life, there are ups and downs and so it was with the Alaska LME community. It was on top of the world and operating like a finely tuned piano when unforeseen and unwelcome circumstances began. From lack of potential couples for the weekend, to decreased numbers on weekends, to burnout in the community and rigid rules that began to create tension and concern, the community began to



breakdown. The last LME weekend held in the late 80s. boasted the largest number of participants ever in the final weekend sing off. It was truly a grand and appropriate ending to the once thriving and successful LME community.

We feel privileged and honored to share, first hand, the continued story as it unfolded some ten years later. Yes, ten years had gone by without any LME weekends, without Love Circles and without the community fellowship and love that was once so freely shared and experienced in Alaska. All the many involved and committed community couples had moved on in their lives to other ministries and goals, still holding their special and real memories of LME days gone by. Meanwhile, somewhere in California, the seeds for God's new plan for the Alaska LME community were being planted. Michael & Barbara Pier and their 17-year old daughter, living in Benicia, California were about to embark on an unexpected adventure that would literally turn their world around. Once again God's plan involved using ordinary people for his extraordinary plans. Michael's company sent him to Alaska on a "temporary" assignment. Without warning this "temporary" assignment became a "permanent"

assignment. When Michael and Barbara discovered LME hadn't been active for ten years in Alaska it was devastating news. LME had become such an important part of their lives. How could they give up a ministry that had become such a blessing? How could they pull their teenage daughter out of high school and force her to "start over" making friends and being accepted? Heartfelt prayers were lifted regarding the decision to accept the position in Alaska or remain in California. It wasn't until Michael and Barbara were approached with the idea to consider trying to revive the LME community in Alaska that they were able to decide. With tremendous encouragement from the ME communities in District V, Michael and Barbara answered "yes" to Alaska, despite major objection from their teenage daughter.

Shortly after the move, Michael and Barbara were given a few names of previously involved and active couples. No one even knew if the numbers were current or if these couples still loved in Alaska, except God, of course. Those few numbers proved to be the foundation that was needed to begin rebuilding the LME community. Yes, there were many factors and actions that contributed to the rebuilding process. Once initial telephone contacts and introductions were made, the first Love Circle was held with five couples. It was important to restore fellowship and sharing between the couples. After several Love Circle meetings, Michael and Barbara presented the idea of bringing LME weekends back to Alaska. As the majority of the couples had

experienced "burn out" and dissatisfaction with some of the rigid rules that had been in place, they were very cautious and hesitant. They were relieved to learn some of the "rigid" rules had been changed and that the new LME Alaska community had tremendous encouragement and support from the entire District V. Ron & Nancy Hawke, the District V Area Lay Contact Couple, came up for a Board Meeting/Love Circle to encourage and provide direction. The Seattle/Washington areas also provided verbal encouragement and prayers for the revival of the Alaska LME community. Michael and Barbara did their best to assure the couples there would be a true "sharing" of the responsibilities to avoid all the work load and loving tasks falling on just a few couples. Michael and Barbara also attended several Interfaith Love Circles with the Catholic and Episcopal communities who offered their love, prayers and support for the return of Lutheran weekends to Alaska.

It seemed ambitious, but the now excited and bonded LME Alaska community scheduled two ME weekends in 1999. That was approximately 8 months away. It seemed almost miraculous how things began to fall into place after that. It was obvious God was behind their efforts and he was in charge.

What a joy to see God's plan unfolding. Couples began to accept Board positions and a hotel was secured at an extremely reasonable rate. Board

Meetings and Love Circles were held regularly. After Michael and Barbara held many church & home information talks and church mailings went out, registrations

began to come in. Michael and Barbara worked with the Seattle/ Washington areas to secure three presenting couples to join them as the first Alaska presenting team. (Clergy: Ted & Marty Hartman; Admin: Ron & Pat Olson; Mid: Michael and Barbara Pier: and Rookie: Mark & Kari Hooper). Ron & Pat Olson from the Washington/ Seattle Area brought wall banners with them. These were the same banners previously made and used in Alaska some ten year prior. What a delight to have the original banners back. A work session was held prior to the first weekend date to make rooms signs and finalize all

weekend details. Everything was in place to hold the first LME weekend in ten years.

Yes, this is a "success" story. All the prayers, meetings, love circles, work sessions, telephone calls, organizing, information talks, & dinners (wining, dining & signing) culminated into a fantastic weekend and a reunited community. Twenty six (26) couples were encountered. Yes, there were a few glitches on the weekend. The clergy couple arrived late Friday night, so their first talks were faxed to the hotel and read by the Admin. & Mid couples. Couples woke up Saturday morning to discover there was almost no hot water for showers. Food lines were extremely slow until a new line arrangement was put in place. The hotel lounge had a very "loud" party Saturday evening. Despite these minor "bumps" on the weekend, it was truly a "mountaintop" experience for everyone involved. From the luggage carriers Friday evening, the couples handling board positions and loving tasks, the presenting team, the prayer couples, and the couples all over the world who participated in the prayer vigil, it was truly a weekend of healing, revival and joy.

When the doors opened and the multitude of community & prayer couples literally poured into the sing-off, there wasn't a dry eye in the room. For most of the previous community, it was like a family "reunion". Some hadn't seen each other for almost ten years. The international response of couples for the massive prayer vigil and the many community couples who participated in the weekend was incredible.

This was indeed God's weekend, and all felt tremendous pride and joy in being a part of it. Yes, the Alaska LME community is again alive and well. What Michael and Barbara once feared could be an "impossible task" had become "possible" with God leading every step of the way. To ensure "new blood" will continually be flowing in the community, the community is working hard to recruit/invite the newly encountered couples to join the community and consider board positions/loving tasks. We are also implementing a "mentorship" program to help new couples accepting board positions get a firm grasp on their responsibilities. Yet, this is not the "end of the story, but just the beginning. The new Alaska LME community stands strong and committed as they work together toward the next Alaska weekend and, God willing, many more to follow. This story is indeed living proof that "WE CAN CHANGE THE WORLD".

family.




We were encountered in the Twin Cities in April of 1981 and attended our Deeper Weekend in St. Louis, MO, in March of 1982.

They are making use of technology and are sending international news by email on a monthly basis. This is a test that will be evaluated at the summer European Board meeting. They believe that by sharing of community news in this way we can become a closer international family in a way similar to how our dialogue strengthens our marriage relationship. The North American Region (NAR) had their board meeting close to Los Angeles the first weekend in February, and the two European Executive couples, Ebba and Carl Eric Svensater and Anna-Liisa and Matti Viitaanen, were there. Organization

Short background for those with organizer personality style (new outline).

NAR covers both USA and Canada, and there are five districts, No 1 from North to South on the East Coast, two districts in the middle and two on the West Coast, the northernmost districts also include Canada. The executive couples and the district contact couples meet in the NAR board two times per year. NAR organize roughly 100 weekends per year with around 1600 couples.

The European Region comprises four countries (districts) plus
Denmark as an outreach. Due to high travelling costs the board convenes only once a year, next time in
Sweden in July. Europe does approximately 25 weekends per year with a total of 600 couples.

Sweden

ME in Sweden is growing. For the first time there are two active clergy couples: Hans Joachim and Agneta Franze (agneta.franze@gislaved.se) presented their first full weekend February 5-7. They are now also acting as Clergy Contact couple for Sweden. Ebba and Carl Eric Svensater will continue as Regional Clergy Execs another 1.5 year.

Norway

The Norwegian board has set up a committee to work on post weekend activities. The emphasis will be on personal relations right after the weekend. But we also want to evaluate post weekend programs. We have access to a number of different Bridge programs. They play an important part in the Catholic ME, but we have never actually run them here in Scandinavia.

It would have been interesting if any of you have concrete experience from Bridge programs. We remember from a family reunion talking to a couple who told us that the Bridge Program was an integrated part of the ME offer in their area. Can anybody help us to get in touch? We are also looking forward to the new Bridging Hearts program announced at the NAR meeting last summer.

Iceland

Late Sunday night Feb 14, we had an excited Willy on the phone from Iceland (Ragnheidur and Willy Petersen, lay contact couple):

"We are just back from singoff after a fantastic weekend. Thirty-six couples attended, and we were 500 people at the singoff. On Friday night 100 people showed up to help, of which 65 also took part in the restaurant dinner after the weekend had started. On Saturday night 200 people were gathered in three different churches to pray for the weekend, one so close that the people attending could see the weekend site, one outside the city and one church on the northern coast."

This is Iceland in a nutshell: 270.000 inhabitants totally, and Lutheran Marriage Encounter now approaching 2% of the population when you count the ones who have been to weekends and the 800 people on the waiting list.

We once had the opportunity to celebrate a weekend with the Icelandic community, and we will never forget. We hope to get a second chance.

But success creates work more than anything. Please, remember the Icelandic community in your prayers.

The new weekend

All the couples in North America already preparing for the new weekend talks impress us. In Europe so far, four couples are writing, and we will have our first pilot weekend April 23. It seems to be close race, as we understand the first NAR weekend will be at about the same time.

The European weekend will be held in Norwegian/Swedish, and we hope to get the message across also to the couples coming from the other countries and who have other mother tongues. The weekend follows the NAR outline. We call it a pilot since we have to evaluate after the weekend whether minor cultural adjustments will be necessary.

Alaska

We are happy also to tell about the recent Alaska weekend. Two couples have shared this event with us. When Ron and Pat Olson lived up there, some ten years ago, there was a thriving community in Alaska, but then it vanished.

But the Olsons continued to have a dream of breathing life back into the Alaska community, and a couple of years ago, a presenting couple moved up to Anchorage. The Olsons worked with them, and Jan 8 - 10 they presented on a 30 couple weekend.

We are well aware of how busy your lives are now, but it is

It is quite probable that in your local area, too few couples are having to do too much of the work. This happens when couples fail to understand that for the dream to be realized, we must lovingly respond to the blessing that the Lord has given to each of us.

AREA LOVING TASKS

Community Activities Coordinator - Coordinates couple and family events to strengthen local Marriage Encounter community.

Finance Couple - Handles all financial transactions for the Area.

Gift Shop Coordinator (Memorabilia Couple) - Handles the sale of Marriage Encounter gifts such as LME jewelry, stickers, calendars, magnets, key chains, etc. at all community events.

Inviting (and Publicity)

Coordinator - Coordinates all inviting activities - publicity, Temple Talks, church mailings, etc.

Label Couple - Produces labels for LME mailings

Love Circle Coordinator -Maintains updated list of active Love Circles

Mailing couple - Labels and sorts copies for mailing

Newsletter Couple - Prints and assembles items for quarterly newsletter

Post Weekend Coordinator -Coordinates all post weekend

activities, Encounter Evenings, Community Nights etc.

Prayer Chain Coordinators -Make sure prayer concerns are communicated to all board members

Reservation Couple (Scheduling Couple) - Handles all registrations for weekends, LME information.

Secretary Couple - Prepares minutes of board meetings and sends copies to the board members

WEEKEND LOVING TASKS

Banner Couple - Stores and maintains banners used on the weekend. (Hangs door banners on Friday night of the weekend).

Facilities Couple - Contacts and visits hotels, motels etc., to determine suitability for weekends, meets with sales person to negotiate contracts, submits contract to District Lay Contact Couple for approval, (acts as liaison between facility and presenters on weekend.) This may be done by W/E Coord.

Greeter Couple Coordinator (Hosting Couple) - Coordinates

hotel check-in on Friday night. Needs many helpers on Friday night to escort couples to their rooms.

Map Couple - Prepares maps to weekend facility, potlucks, renewals etc. and distributes copies for weekend packets, presenters, prayer couples and community.

Name Tag and Placecard Couple - Prepares name tags and placecards for each weekend, making any corrections necessary on Friday night of weekend

Potluck Coordinator Couple -Handles setup of potluck on Sunday, maintains supplies for coffee, etc., stays at the church to warm food, set out food etc. (Could also be responsible for finding church and making arrangements).

Prayer Couple Coordinators - Find prayer couples for all couples on the weekend. Prepares the love letters to go into the packets.

Room Banner couple (Joy Banners) - Finds groups or individuals to make banners for each Weekend, arranges for delivery to Weekend. May also prepare designs and patterns for banners.

Scheduling Couple - Receives 800# referrals, makes contact with those who are on a "prospect list", schedules couples for Weekend of their choice, receives applications and checks, forwards checks to Dist. Finance Couple.

Setup and Take-down Couple

- Handles setup and take-down of conference room, first aid table etc.

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
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Hey Lord, Pick Another Lasagna Maker

Since our weekend, our social calendar has revolved around Marriage Encounter events. Everything from the Geauga County Fair booth to romantic dinners to printing the next Focus newsletter have helped fill our time. Yesterday we were making lasagna together. I never thought I would ever make lasagna. Is this what you have us do as a ministry Lord?

Brown the sausage, add the ground beef...prepare you heart for the Lord. The grease splatters and I stir a bit of the meat onto the stove top. I put the meat back in the pan they will never know. I reach over and give Raye a quick squeeze.

A layer of sauce for spice...just like the Word - [1st Timothy 4:6] nourished in the word of faith...add the lasagna noodles, now hard, but soon to become edible in the cooking process [Mark 3:5] and Jesus grieved for the hardness of their hearts.

Ricotta cheese mixture - what a bunch of sloppy goo. Are we really going to eat this? Like sin, that destroyed the beauty of God's world, we need to follow the scripture found in 1 Peter [4:13] partake of the sufferings of Christ. That was not a time of beauty, but God had a plan in which to work -Out of the suffering and death of Jesus, came the glory of grace and salvation.

Add a cup of meat

[1 Corinthians 5:13]...Food for the stomach and the stomach for food but God will destroy them both. . . Do you not know that our bodies are members of Christ himself?... sprinkle on a cup or so of Mozzarella Cheese [Isaiah 13:7]...and every man's heart shall melt.



The dinner starts in two minutes and only one of the couples has arrived. What should I do now? [Hebrews 10:36]...You have need of patience

you would have us do? [Job 24:13]...There are those who rebel against the light, who do not know its ways or stay in its paths...[Hebrews 13:1] Keep on loving each other as brothers. Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some people have entertained angels without knowing it.

The numbers are important to us Lord, but you have the total direction of this ministry under your guidance. I pray that if we are to be instruments of your hand, we need to be willing to spread the message to one or to one hundred. Thank you Lord for your love which has allowed us to find, marry and love our spouse. May we stay focused on doing your will and not trying to take over and set expectations which you do not have. Lord may we never use this as a reason not to be actively recruiting for weekends. I pray that you place those couples that need to hear about your saving grace or about Marriage Encounter in our paths, and that we be attuned to the need to share the message with them.
