found that we were all comfortable completing tasks behind the scenes.

Pastor Al made concluding remarks and encouraged those that wanted to learn more about the Enneagram to take the journey and enjoy their findings.



Later, I went back to Dr. Sager's information and realized that in the journey of the day, he led me "home" and my actions throughout the day reinforced the power of the Enneagram at helping people identify traits associated with their personality style. It also opened up many new doors of insight and understanding of what makes others behave as they do. So, THANK YOU Dr. Sager, Pastor Sager, Al, my friend for engaging me during this journey and during a time of national tragedy so that I may find myself on the Enneagram. While I will long remember the location I was when Columbia was lost, it will be with fond memories knowing I was among friends, in a place of love and on a journey of deeper self discovery.



Want some new questions about sex to spice up your **COUPLE*** dialogue life? How about great open sharing on the topic within your love circle/spiral **GROUP****? This

column highlights some of the resources available on sexuality! Except as noted, all are available on the ILME website in the resources section (http://www.ilme.org).

The newly revised resource index begins with many files of dialogue questions, including these resources about sex:

#172 – "45 Dialogue Questions about Sex"

#174 – "The 90 Day Sex Guarantee" (ninety days in a row? Now that's a real dialogue challenge! Wow – how might you feel at the end of THAT?!)

#175 – "Our Intimacy Grows . . . Through Dialogue." Request this resource directly from Duffy & Nan Guthrie, your North American Region resource couple. This booklet (by Bill & Lori Trickey of WWME) is set up similar to the WEDS manual. It includes six weeks of dialogue questions, with background paragraphs and questions for a week centered around a certain aspect of our sexuality, including these topics:

- (1) Developing Attitudes
- (2) Falling in Love With You
- (3) Did I Ever Tell You?
- (4) Getting to Know Myself
- (5) God's Plan for Us is Unity
- (6) Expectations?

A couple of articles which might generate healthy discussion at any kind of a M.E. group meeting are #334 – "A Different Kind of Love Triangle," by Mark Golin, and #349 – "Sex in the Marriage Relationship."

We encourage you to use these resources and others to connect with your M.E. compatriots and with your spouse through sharing on sexuality! Visit the ILME website to see the complete listing of resources which are available to all of us. And now for the **featured resource**, which follows in its entirety – a love circle presentation titled "Sexuality in a 24 Hour Relationship." Please use this outline and share it with others!



SEXUALITY IN A 24 HOUR RELATIONSHIP

INTRODUCTION:

Our objective in this talk is to look at the kind of openness we bring to our sexuality, and to try to bring it into the other aspects of our lives. We can truly live our male-femaleness when we use the elements that work for us in sexuality and day to day interaction to bring us closer to other areas of our lives together. If we truly believe that our sexuality is from God then it can't be a third party in our lives.

PART ONE:

The elements of sexuality that bring us close.

- 1. openness and honesty
- 2. desire for more closeness
- 3. non-verbal
- 4. revelation of the beauty we see in each other (physical and spiritual)
- 5. eagerness to share ourselves
- 6. desire to listen and learn about each other.

- A. Briefly go through this list and mention how each of these elements has brought you closer sexually as male-female. (This is not merely in the sex act.)
- B. Point out the fact that sexuality in a 24 hour relationship ties into the other aspects of our day—work, dialogue, children, the house, encounter activities, conversation, entertaining, church, decision-making, fighting, social activities, family crises, etc.
- 1. Select one of these areas and share some of the ways you see a need to bring the elements you use in sexuality into this area. (Ex. We certainly allow our children to see us fight but do we allow them to see us make love? Or pet? Or sneak a feel? Or be physical at all? Are **each** of us physical with each of them?)
- 2. Share what effects bringing these elements of sexuality into this area has on our relationship.

PART TWO:

Using sexuality (the total male-female of us) as a resource for our relationship, point out the fact that through our sexuality we learn a lot about each other, and that this information can be valuable when we use it in order to love each other more.

- 1. Share a specific way I learned through sexuality a way I could be more for you. (Ex. not being able to verbalize my feelings during lovemaking yet being quite verbal otherwise. How we worked on this **together**, and that **change** is necessary.)
- 2. Share how I can use this knowledge, how I try to reach out to you, as we do in dialogue, to share the experience and grow.
 - 3. Share the joys of this reaching out.

10/10: In what area of our sexuality do I need to



be more open with you? HDIFAMA?

SHARING: H o w has our awareness of our total sexuality as man and woman influenced the other areas of our lives?


***************** *** *** Marriage Is Like A Garden
