(in no particular order)

- 1. Lack of personal inviting
- 2. Lack of church support
- 3. Lower church attendance
- 4. Lack of widespread recognition
- 5. Misconception that we are a ministry for marriages in trouble (vs being marital enrichment for all marriages)
- 6. Rising facilities costs increasing the 'quote'
- 7. Cultural attitudes that marriage is: a) disposable, b) unnecessary, and c) that we should be serving gay couples
- 8. Married couples are maxed out and are reticent to add yet another commitment to their overloaded schedules
- 9. Increasingly people are not joiners of live groups and spend much more time on depersonalized social media
- 10. In its earlier days, Marriage Encounter was the only (or one of very few) marriage enrichment opportunities offered; now there many, often done with high professionalism, sophisticated marketing, and often combined with entertainment. We have a lot of competition.
