





Attention all presenters: CHECK YOUR "SELF" TALK

As you may have noticed in the <u>Interfaith Report</u> included in the NAR minutes, the Catholics have been carrying on Workshops called "Formation Through Relationship" which are intended to improve the quality and consistency of workshopping. One of the stumbling blocks they <u>still</u> run into is distinguishing the difference between personality style and behaviors. As clearly stated in our Lutheran talk outline, **personality style** "*is the essence of who I am...It reflects my identity, becoming more apparent from childhood through adulthood.*" **Behavior** is "*a learned and adaptable manner of presenting myself...Behaviors may be different depending on whether the setting is work, home or play.*" Behaviors "*have been learned over a lifetime, but as opposed to my personality style, they are much more subject to adaptation and change. Behaviors can be learned as well as unlearned.*" So be sure that in your Self talk your personality style is portrayed as being a consistent and unchanging aspect of who you are; only the behaviors may change and vary depending on your situation.

Also, we've also been asked to remind couples that we are trying to not use the phrase "makes me feel" in our talks as it is believed that nothing can <u>make</u> you feel a certain way. Thanks for doing all you can to make your talks super!
